Chairman's report for AGM 2021

For the last 18 months we have not been able to meet face to face and we have only been able to deliver one printed copy of our Magazine, The Addington. It has not been easy to keep on top of things.

On Tuesday the 7th September this year the committee was finally able to met face to face again and we are now aiming to produce a regular hard copy of the Magazine, so things should slowly be getting back to normal. But this pandemic is far from over and we have all to be resilient and take the proper precautions.

As you know the Croydon Council is bankrupt and one of the things that has been scrapped is the refurbishment of Addington Park children's playground, so our children are suffering again.

Work has started at Pioneer Place. The backfield has been dug up and flattened. It is now a field of chalk and all the Orchids and wild flowers are gone. We do not at present know exactly what is happening as no formal planning application has been submitted to the Council.

Over the weekend 14/15th August a Music Festival was held in Addington Park. There was some noise pollution and incidents of drug dealing and drug use were reported. There are some rumours that this Music Festival may be held twice a year at the park. If so we will protest.

During the year we have attended Zoom meetings with the London Green Belt Council, Sanderstead and Selsdon Rotary Community Forum and the Selsdon Community Plan Steering Group.

We hope that we will slowly get back to normal again, but it is not going to be easy to get the Council involved in anything as there is no money. The Councillors Community Budget has been cut and it is not known when, if ever, it will be restored.

We hope that you have weathered the pandemic in good health and are enjoying some freedom.

Treasurers Report 2021

This has been a difficult year for everyone with the Covid 19 restrictions impacting on all our lives, in many ways, and the Association has not been immune to this. We offered a collection service to those who needed to self-isolate and joined with Huntingfield Methodist Church and the Rotary Club with Food Bank collections.

To minimise the possible spread of the pandemic it was decided to put the magazine online and we sent out the quarterly reports to those residents who had provided their internet details. We were sorry that it was not possible to keep more people informed but we could only work with the details we had been given.

As a result of these restrictions, we decided that it would be unfair to continue to charge our Advertisers for a service we could not fully provide, and we decided to give our long-term supporters a twelve-month holiday. Also, it was not possible to send out our annual request for the resident's subscription. The result of these measures meant that income for last year was severely reduced and resulted in a loss for the period as shown on the attached audited accounts.

It is important that we reverse this trend as without a sustainable reserve of funds we will be unable to fight on behalf of you to protect our local environment in the future. With the Government already showing signs of breaking their promises to maintain the Metropolitan Green Belt because of the *acute housing shortage* our local green spaces could disappear, and we would become part of the urban sprawl unless we resist.

Unfortunately, when we contacted our Advertisers with a view to continuing their participation in the magazine some of them have not responded, this could be because of the effect the pandemic has had on their businesses, and it looks like our income will be affected again next year. Therefore it is most important that we return to previous levels reached in our request for subscriptions. I would ask all of you where possible to make payment of your subscriptions by either a Standing Order with your bank or an annual one-off payment through your bank. Otherwise please use the little brown envelope.

Remember an organisation is only as good as its participants if they all pull together in the common will. The coming years are likely to throw up several challenges and we must be ready to meet them. If you are able to join the Committee and become a part of your community working for everyone's benefit you will be most welcome.

Minutes of Virtual Annual General Meeting held 1st December 2020 at 8.00pm using Video Conferencing

1) Apologies were received from Gina Stoneman and Cllr Helen Pollard.

2) Minutes of the previous year's AGM were approved and adopted (proposed by Keith James, seconded by Malcolm Graveling).

3) Matters arising

The Green Corridor and Pioneer Place issues will be addressed later in the meeting

New unsolicited approaches have been made to some residents in Featherbed Lane and Falconwood Road, this time by CDR Evolution, to buy up back gardens to build more houses. We are not aware that any residents have responded

Still no progress on completing the yellow lines in Huntingfield and Featherbed Lane on the church corner (ClIr Helen Pollard to be asked to follow-up)

The Council's improvement plans for the Addington Park childrens' playground area are unlikely to be completed due to the Council's worsening financial state

4) Chairman's Annual report

We are not able to hold our AGM face to face as we normally do so we are now doing it via ZOOM. From May 2019 until February 2020 all was normal and we carried out the concerns of our Residents. From February things have been very different with Covid19 and all the restrictions so we had to hold Committee meetings by Zoom. I hope that you are all well and that you have been able to stay safe during the pandemic.

During the pandemic we have taken part in the London Green Belt AGM and observed a Planning Committee Meeting at Croydon Council, both via Zoom. From the London Green Belt, we learned that they have made a strong objection to the Government Housing White Paper. We did not learn much from the Planning Committee meeting.

We have also objected to the Government Housing White Paper, and to the new increased Parking Charges for Croydon which are planned to take place from January 2021.

We objected to the Liquor License for Addington Park. This Application has since been withdrawn but a new Application may be launched. We will monitor the situation.

The planned upgrade of the play area in Addington Park has been cancelled due to the Council being bankrupt.

Pioneer Place has been bought by the Shia Muslims. They said they intend to use the existing buildings for worship and were not going to develop the site. The back field will be used for relaxation and meditation by their members. Their intention is to make Pioneer Place a hub for community activity.

Since our first contact with the Shia Muslim group we have learned that they are planning a major development on the site. This development is out of character with the area and cannot be accepted. We will call for the BACKFIELD to get SINC status with some form of limited public access, and a sensible development on the rest of the site in character with surrounding area.

We are very sorry to hear that during the lock-down there were people in our area who were unable to get the basic necessities and had to press the emergency button to get help. We do not want anything like this to happen again. We are here to help and we are able to arrange shopping and pick up of medicines etc. It is therefore very important that we get to know of people that may need help. If you are in the group needing help or know of anyone needing help please contact me at wiktor.molleskog@sky.com or phone 07704797673/01689843404 or Salli at editor@addingtonresidents.com so that we can build a data base to work from. I ask all residents in our area to give us their email addresses so we can more easily get in touch with important information. We will not use these addresses to bombard you with all kinds of rubbish. Please be assured that your e-mail addresses will not be misused, given to anybody or sold on. I ask for volunteers to help with shopping and pickup of medicines for housebound residents should it be needed.

Also there are 2 vacant places on the committee and we ask for volunteers as well.

I urge you to keep to government guidelines, stay safe and look after yourselves.

5) Treasurer's Report

Once again, we are pleased to report to the members that our finances are in good order. With your support and that of our advertisers we can show a healthy balance sheet.

Our reserves have increased over the year as our expenditure for the year decreased whilst there has been a small increase in our income. Subscriptions increased by £75, Advertising reduced by £220 and Sundries increased by £60, whilst printing costs were reduced by £241, Donations fell by £250, resulting in an overall difference of £376 for the year. This increase in our reserves may come in handy if the need ever arises that we must seek the use of professional services to protect our environment. With the current proposals before Parliament to change the way Planning decisions are to be made, and with our knowledge of how the local authority have recently had a cavalier approach to the current planning regulations, these funds may prove to be crucial in our efforts to resist any detrimental changes.

The problems arising from the Covid -19 pandemic mean that the results for the current year are likely to be very different as we are unable to send out our invoices for advertising due to not being able to publish our magazine. Also, we are not able to ask you for your annual subscription in the usual way so we asked those able to pay directly to our account by means of a Bank transfer. It is important that we maintain our ability to protect our community assets, so we need your continued support by way of subscriptions and advertising revenue. Without your help we cannot continue our efforts. We have some 270 email contacts for residents, out of a possible 750+ households; so that we can communicate more effectively, please let us have your email address.

Note our thanks to Winston Leeks for auditing the Annual Accounts again. Adoption of the Accounts was proposed by Keith James and seconded by Mike Bond.

6) Report from Sarah Jones, MP Croydon Central

I have dealt with around 8000 cases of people asking for help or offering their views since the beginning of covid. With only a small support team that is a lot, but I do my best to answer everyone as quickly as possible. If anyone would like to get in touch my email is sarah.jones.mp@parliament.uk and my phoneline is 0208 191 7064. Surgeries are possible on the phone or on zoom – I am not doing face-to-face at the moment.

Covid has taken up most of my time this year as you can imagine – with hundreds of people in Croydon losing their lives. At the start of the pandemic, we were helping people travel home from countries around the world, and I was working with care homes to try and get them enough PPE. We worked with the voluntary sector and the mutual aid groups to ensure people got food and the shielding were able to eat. I had to work with businesses in Croydon to try and get government support schemes in place to enable them to pay their rent and survive. With the arrival of the Dominic Cummings scandal and Black Lives Matter, people suddenly started contacting me with their views again and I received around 2000 emails on those two issues alone. We then moved into the summer when restrictions lifted a bit. Clearly the last few months have been devastating as covid has inevitably risen again, and I have been trying to support businesses who are not getting the same support they had in March. Many self-employment people have not received any support at all and they are now in real trouble in Croydon.

I am Shadow Policing Minister which means I spend a lot of time talking to the police and supporting them through this difficult time. Crime fell dramatically in the first lockdown but rose back fast and is now at pre-covid levels. This means the police are enforcing covid restrictions and having to deal with high crime levels and they need our support.

Clearly everyone will have seen the financial situation of Croydon Council. I am meeting regularly with the new leadership in the Council to discuss changes to processes and decision -making – as well as the decisions themselves – and I can reassure you that fundamental reform is underway. There will be difficult choices ahead which I do not relish and we have to get those decisions right. There are huge lessons to learn, but it is also the case that there are massive financial pressures on the council with 60% cuts since 2010, and Croydon has a particular issue with the cost of unaccompanied asylum seekers which is not reimbursed by government. My priority is to ensure services for our most vulnerable are protected, but that the Council also continue to get the basics right in terms of universal services like the public realm and bin collections.

7) Resignation & Election of Committee Members

All committee members resigned as required by the constitution. Apart from Paul Bearman who has moved away, and Geoff Hopper who stepped down during the year, the remaining committee members all made themselves available and were re-elected.

There remain two vacancies.

8) Any Other Business

i) Alice Hicks enquired whether Thames Water had been notified of the possible Pioneer Place redevelopment adjacent to their waterworks; they have, but are awaiting any formal planning application

ii) Paul Bearman requested the Pioneer Place 'BackField' be 'haycut' to preserve the wild orchid environment; this will be addressed by either this Association or via our MP's office

iii) Joy Ellery enquired about the Council's liquor license application in support of potential large-scale events in Addington Park; this has been withdrawn presently, but a new application may be resubmitted, and we will object again

iv) Fly-tipping on Featherbed Lane has become a problem and the Council will be made aware

v) There has been a spate of catalytic-converter thefts from cars on Falconwood Road and more widely across the borough. The Metropolitan Police have set-up a task force, so please report any incidents to Opbasswood@met.police.uk

Stories

I just love to hear people tell the story of their lives. The other day I drove an elderly lady home from the 'lunch club' at the church. It wasn't very far and as we talked, she told me a little bit of her story. She's 98 years of age! I found that so incredible. She certainly didn't look 98. Then she told me of how during the war, the factory where she worked was bombed whilst they were working. Before long, it had been rehoused in another building and they carried on working. One afternoon, at another lunch club I was visiting, one of the ladies at the table spoke of how she used to fly Spitfire Aeroplanes from the factory to the airfield where they would be used as fighter planes. She wasn't bragging or saying how good she was – it was simply a fact of life and something she had done.

I was quite taken with the story told during the TV show, 'Countryfile', about the hop pickers in Britain during the early 1900's. The presenter went to visit a lady who had been a child at the time and she spoke of the 'holiday atmosphere' on the farms at the time; also, how her mother stuck a big, black umbrella into the ground and she had to fill it with hops before she could go and play with the other children and finally, how she bought her first bicycle with the money she had earned picking hops. Yet, there was another side to it all and sometimes the living conditions of the pickers were quite squalid and unhygienic. That side of the picture was not shown at all and I'm sure there are just as many stories of pain and injustice to the pickers.

I must admit that there are times when I listen to the stories of others that I'm quite ashamed of myself for the times I thought I was hard done by or ill-treated in my life and I'm extremely thankful for the way my life has turned out. That's where our stories become 'restoried' by the Grace of God and the new life we receive through Jesus Christ. I sat enthralled as I listened to a Minister's wife tell us of some of their story. How the only work she could get was to wash dishes through the night. She spoke of how her faith grew by listening to recorded services on a tape recorder whilst washing the dishes. She worked nights, whilst her husband looked after their young family, and she returned home at 5am so that her husband could go to work during the day. She said she was never happier, despite the hard times they were facing.

So, what about your story? Have you ever shared it with anybody? Has your story been restoried by God and how has this been for you and others around you? I can tell you as I've shared my story with others, I am reminded of God's grace and the His power in restorying my life. Not just being restored in Him, but Him re-writing the story of my life and His goodness and part in doing it all. An AED (Defibrillator) is coming to Palace Green

An Automatic Emergency Defibrillator is designed to be used easily by anyone wanting to help a heart attack victim in the vital first minutes. The AED provides an electric shock that will stun the heart muscle so it returns to its normal rhythm. Using an AED within 3 minutes of a cardiac arrest can improve a person's chance of survival by as much as **70%**.

1 in 10 people survive a heart attack, but with a nearby AED, that can rise to 8 in 10. Heart and circulatory diseases cause around 160,000 deaths each year – an average of 460 deaths each day or one every three minutes in the UK.

Shabbir and Richard, at No 2 Palace Green, are installing an AED outside their home, so it is available to all local residents, visitors and church users. Shabbir runs a health and safety company (Safety is the Key Ltd) so is well aware of the importance of a quick first aid response.
